Summary Report on the July 16th Presentation to Board of Education

- Co-Facilitators, Mike Lullo and Steve Neurauter, along with Superintendent Tammaru presented to the Board
- Continue to excel with academic performance
- District has a structural deficit will be spending early taxes in FY19
- Reviewed financials
 - o Lowest tax rate of surrounding districts
 - Of surrounding districts, spending least amount of money per pupil in operational cost
 - o Neighboring districts tax referendum history
 - o CCSD89 has not sought a tax-rate referendum in 32 years
 - Made approximately \$3M in cuts with minimal impact to the classroom (while declining enrollment)
- Timeline of history of work presented
 - o Community Engagement meetings held
 - o Phone surveys were conducted
- What we learned from community through meetings and surveys
 - Educational values
 - High quality teachers
 - Strong educations programming
 - Appropriate class sizes
 - Community involvement
 - School security
 - Educational priorities (consensus) strong correlations between individual and consensus
 - Rigorous curriculum for all learners
 - Operate with a balanced budget without borrowing money
 - Maintaining invention programs
 - Maintaining social-emotional supports
 - o Maintain high quality schools, operate with balance budget but do not want to see programs cut
 - No consensus from group on what to cut
- Some level of consensus on moving to 4-day/week for physical education
- Positive response from phone surveys
- Community supports schools and see connection between good schools and home value
- Approximate annual cost to homeowners of tax-rate increase provided
 - o All groups supported some level of tax-rate increase
- 25 cent increase borrowing from ourselves within 5 years no fund balance short-term solution
- 40 cent increase ten-year solution
- Board unanimously concluded they would vote on putting a question on the ballot for the November 6th election for a 40-cent increase
 - Only vote on one question
- Superintendent Tammaru thanked committee for their work and commitment
