BOARD HIGHLIGHTS - SEPTEMBER 18, 2023 MEETING - 7:02 PM

Consent Agenda – The consent agenda was approved as presented.

DISCUSSION ITEMS

- Student Achievement Report: (BOE Goals: Continuous improvement and improved student learning). A summary report of preliminary student achievement data from 2022-2023 was provided by Asst. Superintendent Kingsfield. Our goal is to have 100% of our students scoring above the 40th percentile (achievement) in math and reading on the MAP Assessment. Achievement gaps persist among student demographic groups. The district has put strategic interventions in place to continue to ensure every single student reaches their full potential.
- 2023-2024 Updated Budget: (BOE Goal: Changing financial needs). Asst. Superintendent Jones presented the updated changes to the 2023-24 school district budget. The district is presenting a budget surplus for the 2023-24 fiscal year. We have an anticipated \$1,282,897 operating fund surplus. Surplus was decreased by \$164,693 since the tentative budget was adopted in July due to a \$291,851 overall increase in revenues and \$457,544 overall increase in expenditures.
- <u>Significant Disproportionality Update:</u> (BOE Goal: Continuous improvement, improved student learning and collaborative and inclusive culture). Student Services Director Kreller, provided an update on the 2022-2023 Significant Disproportionality findings. Since the initial findings and the district's analysis of causes for the findings, the district has put several interventions in place to address the disproportionality. The district has seen an improvement in identification of students for special education services.
- Referendum Financing Update and Discussion: (BOE Goal: Changing financial needs). Tammie Beckwith Schallmo, Managing Director of PMA, presented the current and future standing of the bonds. In June 2022, the district passed a \$27M referendum. The district generated \$18.7M of the referendum bond proceeds through its Series 2022 Bonds. Based on proceeds, the district has \$8.3M of remaining referendum authority. Such authority must be issued no later than June 2027. She updated the Board of Education on the process to access the remaining referendum bonding.
