

Glen Crest families:

This is the weekly summary of people who were at Glen Crest and later tested positive for COVID-19. Daily data is available on the district's website (<https://www.ccsd89.org/Page/8938>) and historical data is available at: <https://bit.ly/3eS1NE5>

From Monday, May 9, to Friday, May 13, there were four students or staff members who were at Glen Crest and subsequently tested positive for COVID-19. The cases are as follows:

- One person reported a positive test on Monday.
- Two people reported a positive test on Tuesday.
- One person reported a positive test on Friday.

The district's current mitigation status is: **REDUCED MITIGATION** (yellow). This means masks are recommended (not required) and visitors are allowed in the building. To see more information about mitigation practices in the current status in CCSD 89, go to: www.ccsd89.org/Page/8994

The district and health department monitor for signs of spread or outbreak within a school. Families will be notified if the health department recommends any attendance change for all or part of the school.

It is critical that families take their child's temperature each day and keep them home if their temperature is above 100.3, or they have COVID-19 symptoms. **Students should stay home and contact the school nurse if they are positive for COVID-19 or have COVID-19 symptoms.** Families can use this chart (<https://bit.ly/3rUY93w>) as a starting point when determining whether your student needs to be quarantined or isolated. Your family's doctor or the school nurse can help resolve any questions.

Students and staff continue to follow all protocols for hand washing, air ventilation, and monitoring. The district will continue to follow cleaning recommendations from the Centers for Disease Control, state officials, and local health departments.

At this time, the most important things your family can do are:

- Make sure your child washes their hands regularly.
- Encourage your student to maintain social distancing.
- Reduce your exposure and risk outside of school.
- Keep your child home if they are sick or if they have COVID-19 symptoms
