



## POSITIVE TEST

### My student has tested positive for COVID-19.

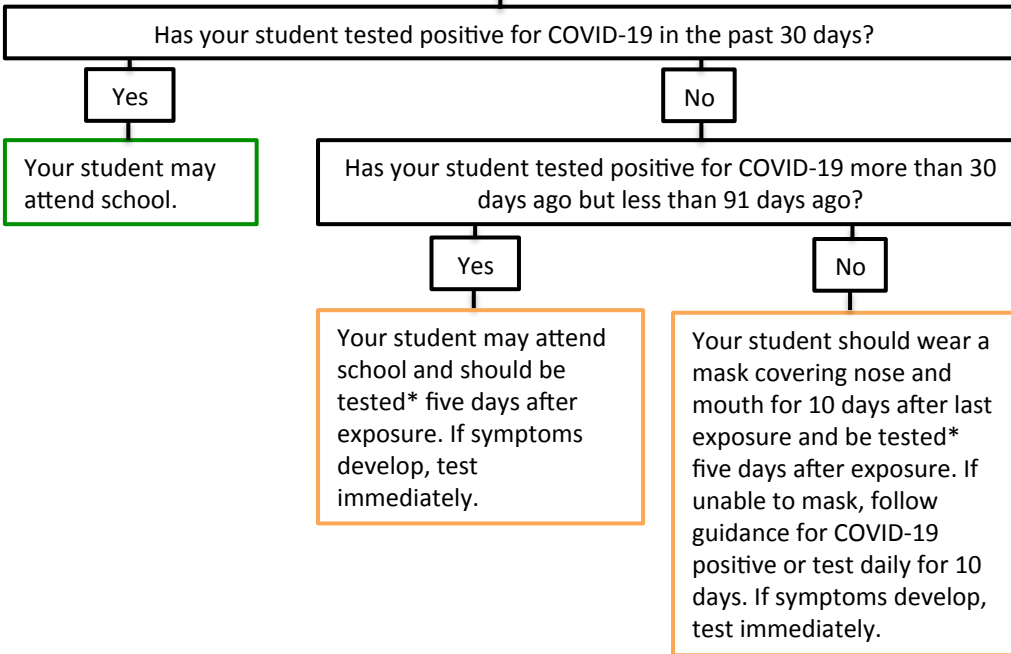
Student must stay home for five calendar days from symptom onset (if symptomatic) or test date (if no symptoms). The district's isolation teacher will reach out to provide assistance. After five days, student can return if symptoms are improving and they have been fever-free for 24 hours without medication. Student must wear a mask at school on days 6 through 10. If unable to mask, isolate for 10 days.

### Returning to school after positive test

Wednesday	Day zero	Symptoms develop and/or student tests positive
Thursday	Day one	
Friday	Day two	
Saturday	Day three	
Sunday	Day four	
Monday	Day five	Student's symptoms improving and fever-free for 24 hours without medication
Tuesday		Return to school

## HIGHER-RISK EXPOSURE

### My student was was a higher-risk exposure to someone who was positive for COVID-19.



### What is a higher-risk exposure?

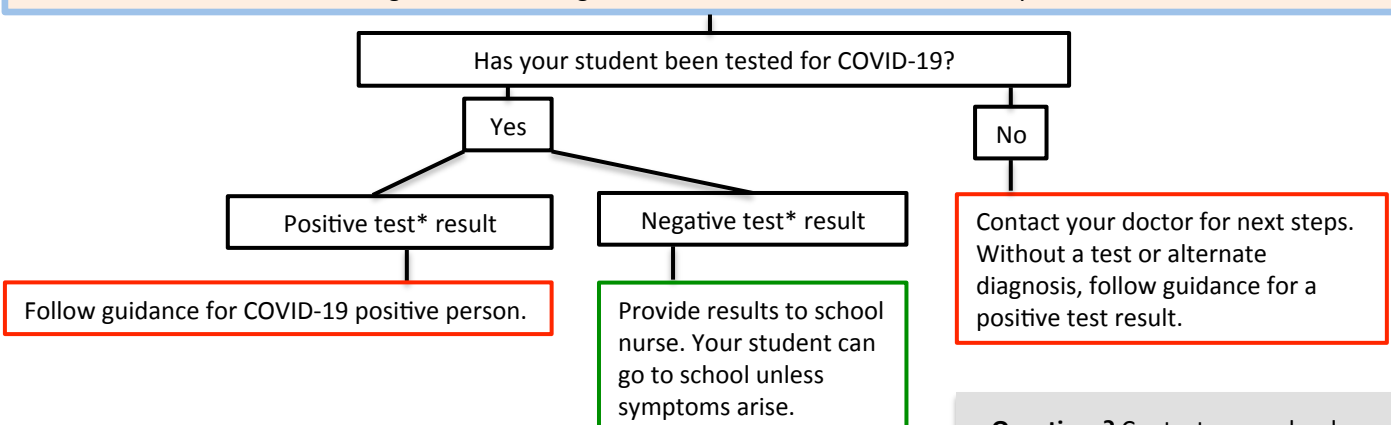
Higher-risk exposure risk is defined as being within six feet of a symptomatic person who was not wearing a mask for more than 15 minutes indoors.

\* Home tests are allowable. A PCR follow-up test may be needed in some circumstances. Negative COVID-19 diagnostic tests are valid only for the date they are collected. All test results should be forwarded to the building nurse at your child's school.

## SYMPTOMATIC

### My student is having COVID-19 symptoms:

Fever of 100.4 or higher; new moderate or severe headache; shortness of breath; new cough; new loss of sense of taste or smell; sore throat; vomiting or diarrhea; fatigue from unknown cause; muscle or body aches from unknown cause.
